PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

La Shana Tova to all. I hope that all who attended enjoyed the High Holy Day services as much as I did. There are many thank yous to go around. Missy and Pat in the office, Steve and Richard and all of the ushers, Rabbi and Cantor, Lisa and above all the Ritual Committee. Most of you have no clue as to how much work goes into preparing for the High Holiday services, identifying and organizing for all of the honors, aliyas, ark openings and so on. Rosalyn and Bill Terzi have been orchestrating these services right up to the final moments of each service for more than 20 years. Our sincerest thanks to both of them for their diligence and hard work on our behalf. For those who did not attend the services were wonderful! My congratulations to Rabbi and to Cantor Mariel, who by the way is a star. I am sharing a portions of my Kol Nidre address in this months article. I talked about the rise in anti-Semitism around the globe, and how I believe that there is a direct link between growing secularism and the lack of congregational affiliation and anti-Semitism. As Jews in America I believe that we have become insulated and comfortable in what said is a free and welcoming society. No one should ever close his or her eyes to the danger in having a false sense of security. Study your history!

You all know that my daughter Sarah became engaged this year. Her soon to be husband has told me on many occasions that I worry too much. He has told me that my worrying just doesn't make a difference. Of course, I beg to differ; **MY** worrying definitely makes a difference! Allow me to share some of what I worry about, and NO; global warming doesn't make the list. From the World Jewish Congress:

- In France...six thugs shouted, "take that, dirty Jew," while they ruthlessly beat a 13 year old Jewish boy outside of his school.
- In Spain...a gang of neo-Nazis attacked a Jewish teen and carved swastikas into his arm.
- In England four thugs, leaving the youngest-just 17 years old-in the hospital with a brain hemorrhage, attacked four young Jews.
- In Germany ...copies of Mein Kampf have been flying off the shelves since publishers began reprinting Hitler's manifesto this past January-it even made the bestseller list!
- In Italy... in the Tuscan town of Grassina, anti Semitic vandals spray-painted, "Jews to the Gas" and swastikas on a Jewish community center.

All of this is in civilized societies, not unlike ours. I worry about this, but Mike is right. My worry will help no one. Or does it. If I bring it to your attention will it make a difference?

At home, in the good old USA, we are all witnessing the growth of secularism and the decline of personal commitment to faith based institutions. Acts of anti-Semitism occur daily, throughout our country and yes even in our back yards. I worry about this a lot and I know that you and I together can make a difference. We can make a difference in our Religious school, preparing our youngest to become leaders in our community and by providing a religious home for all ages. With your help and additional financial support we can continue to teach and live the culture, the traditions and the foundation of our religion, Torah, making it a part of our lives. If we can insure this, then perhaps I can worry a little less!

Maybe it's the world in which we live? A world where technology reigns, cell phones are a necessity, and GPS's tell us the fastest way to arrive at our destination. A world where the adjective awesome has replaced the experience of awe, to strengthen our ability to see that which is impressive, remarkable and praiseworthy in people, places and things all around us.

The Preamble to Beth Am Shalom's constitution reads, "In order to perpetuate Judaism, to serve the Jewish people by providing a place where they can worship and study the teachings of Judaism, and to advance the welfare of all, we dedicate ourselves to the task of sustaining Beth Am Shalom."

The Talmud reads "I found a fruitful world, because my ancestors planted it for me. Likewise I am planting it for my children."

All of you have received your Kol Nidre pledge card for this year and many of you have already returned them along with your donation. On behalf of Beth Am Shalom, thank you. 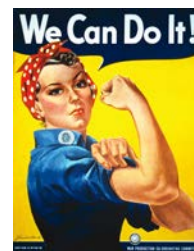

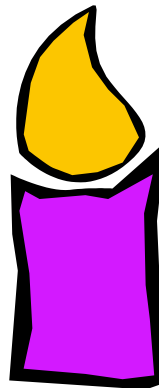

CEMETERY COMMITTEE

Dear Friends,

We at Beth Am Shalom are writing you today in regards to our cemeteries, Beth Olam Memorial Park in Lakewood and Toms River Jewish Cemetery in Toms River. As you are well aware, Beth Olam Memorial Park is in dire need of restoration and beautification. Though much has been done to try and maintain this cemetery, it just hasn't been enough with the limited funds we have.

It has been decided that those of us with loved ones buried there deserve a more serene environment. With this in mind, our cemetery committee has moved forward with a more aggressive plan to rejuvenate the grounds:

1. Grave Stones that have sunk below grade level are being raised to ground level.
2. Starting in late September, a fertilization & seeding program will be started.
3. Irrigation system has been fixed and watering times adjusted to meet needs.

The above courses of action are quite costly and will soon deplete our cemetery fund. In order for us to continue to upkeep our cemeteries and maintain the need of our dearly departed...WE NEED YOUR HELP!!!

Funds are sorely lacking and the cemetery Committee is asking for your help in accomplishing our goals. We are asking for donations to be made to the cemetery fund, in multiples of \$18, chai! These donations can be made on a monthly basis or in one larger amount to be specified to the cemetery fund.

It is up to you and up to us to make the cemetery a place to be proud of.
