SELICHOT REIMAGINED!

Sharing Personal Stories and Reflections this Year for Selichot

Dear Friends,

Selichot refer to “prayers of penitence.” It is also a special service held after the Shabbat just preceding Rosh Hashanah. It affords us the opportunity to place ourselves in the proper frame of mind to welcome the new year and reflect soulfully on our lives.

If you are saying to yourselves, “hmm. I haven’t gone in some years,” or, “I never go to this,” I assure you; we’ve noticed! “We” meaning the rabbis and cantors of the four congregations that join together each year for Selichot. Since early summer, we have been “reimagining” how we might observe Selichot this year. We think you will find our new approach meaningful and enjoyable. We also invite your active participation.

Right now, during this month of Elul, our tradition encourages us to do a *heshbon hanefesh*— taking stock of our souls, a time for self-introspection and evaluation. It is a time to reflect on our lives during this past year and to ponder what we could have done better and what encounter or encounters—ongoing or fleeting—touched our hearts or transformed our lives.

What small decision ended up shaping the outcome of a day. in your life or that changed the very direction or nature of your life. In what way did a small gesture, a brief interaction or an insignificant conversation awaken you, comfort you, inspire you, change you?

We are asking you, our congregants, to submit a very brief story, poem or reflection that answers those questions. From the submissions we receive, your Rabbis and Cantors will select some of them to be read during the Community Selichot Service this year which will take place Saturday, September 9 at our Temple. If your piece is chosen, you are welcome to read it at the service.

Submissions should be no more than 200 words and be submitted by email to me at theravzahav@aol.com. Please send your text directly in the email, (i.e, not via attachment) **to me absolutely no later than Labor Day, September 4**. Please be aware that all submissions will be printed and distributed during the service.

This year’s Selichot service in-the-round will be a new spiritual model for our community. **Its success depends on your presence** and the intimacy that we will create by sitting together in a circle. Therefore, we will not livestream this service. We hope to see you on September 9.

We wish you and all your loved ones a healthy and sweet new year.

This will be the first of a series of experiential adult programs which will meet on selected Sundays 10:30am-12:00pm:

Sept 10 - "High Holy days Experience - Color, Sound, and Movement" - Experience the special colors, sounds and movements for High Holy days - Bring your shofar if you have one. Wear a kittel, beat your breast, blow the shofar, bow prostrate before the ark - here's our chance to learn about, practice, and discuss our feelings about these and other unique High Holy days rituals.

Nov 5 - "Torah Experience" - Experience Torah close-up - dressing, undressing, rolling, crowning, processing, lifting. Examine the scroll, the ink, the seams, and the lithography.

Dec 10 - "Chanukah Experience" - Experience candles, dreidles, latkes, gelt, menorahs, sufganiyot, songs - leave with some fun and meaningful ideas to enhance your Channukah

Jan 7 - "Shir Experience". Experience the form and taste (Nusach and Trop) of Biblical song. Call and respond, dance with timbrals, intone from pre-modern Jewish musical notation.

Feb 4 - "Purim Experience" (more info to come)

April 21 - "Seder Experience" - Experience the sights, sounds, smells, tastes, and, of course, the stories - Share your seder customs and learn about others.

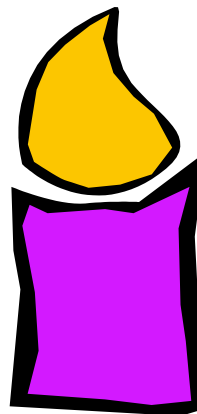
