Rabbi's Message

Being Jewish in a Time of Turmoil: Questions for our Time

It is almost a year ago that all of us in the Ocean County region came together for Selichot. It was refreshing and made for a beautiful start to our penitential High Holy Day period. But no sooner did we gather to conclude that period with Simchat Torah (Rejoicing in the Torah) that our joy turned to mourning. The unthinkable had occurred on 10-7.

The more we learned, the more the horror grew. That tragedy ushered in most tumultuous year for all Jews worldwide, especially for our People in Israel. I know many of us are constantly thinking of our hostages and praying for their safe return. We were overjoyed at the rescue of a few of the hostages, and then heartbroken when six were murdered when their would-be rescuers were close to reaching them. The depravity of Hamas terrorists has no limits.

We pray with our bodies and hearts turned toward Jerusalem. We have been praying that the remaining hostages in Gaza will be freed soon and that they will be reunited alive with their families and friends. We also pray for the end of the suffering of the Palestinian People; may their leaders stop hiding behind them so as to continue drawing Israel's weapons upon their own people. As our Torah teaches, "If your enemy falls, do not exult; If he trips, let your heart not rejoice..." (Prov.24:17) and as we discussed on a recent Shabbat Golda Meir's statement: "We do not rejoice in victories. We rejoice when a new kind of cotton is grown and when strawberries bloom in Israel."

The events of this past year have shaken our collective foundations to their core. How do we cope with such adversity and grimness? **Selichot offers an opportunity** to speak about it, to reflect, to come, at least temporarily, together, to process our grief together, but also to express our hopes, fears and joys together.

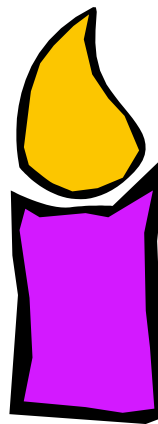
